Little Wolf Pond

Survey Date: June 11, 2019 Last Surveyed: 2016

Lake Description

Little Wolf Pond is 159.18-acres and has 2.39-miles of shoreline. It is located in the town of Tupper Lake, Franklin County and lies in the Raquette River watershed. The team launched one motorboat with permission at the Little Wolf Campground.

Aquatic Invasive Plant Presence

No invasive plants were detected.

Native Plant Biota

Comprehensive surveys of all native plants found within the pond were not prioritized in 2019 as this data had previously been collected in 2016. Native species detected in Little Wolf Pond were: *Potamogeton robbinsii* (fern pondweed), *Nitella* spp., *Vallisneria americana* (eelgrass), *Fontinalis* spp. (aquatic moss), and *Eriocaulon* spp. (pipewort). Due to high waters and a prolonged rainy spring, this survey done earlier in the season showed little plant growth.

Aquatic Invasive Animal Presence

Sediment sieves were taken to determine the presence of *Corbicula fluminea* (Asian clams). None were found. Three plankton tows were also conducted with no invasive zooplankton detected. Banded mystery snails (*Viviparus georgianus*) were detected in the pond.
